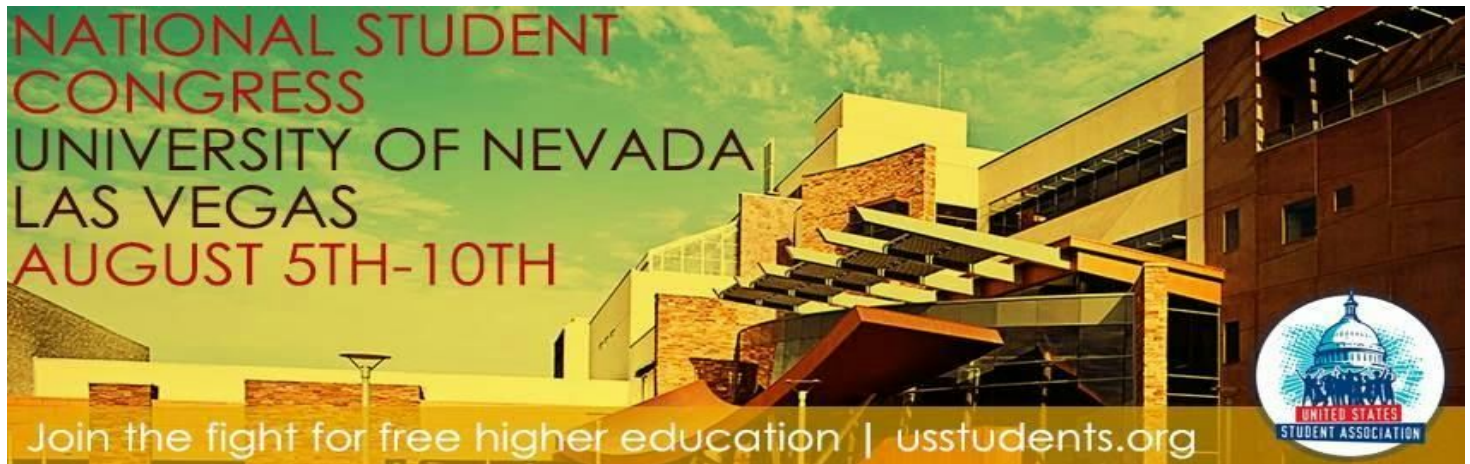


USSA: National Student Congress (NSC) 2015



What is National Student Congress?

The National Student Congress (NSC) is hosted by the United States Students Association, the oldest and largest student run, student led organization. This event lasts five days and provides students the opportunity to participate in the decision making process of shaping the national student movement and elect USSA's leadership for 2015-2016 period. This year's 68th annual Congress is going to be at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas from August 5th to 10th. Last year, students voted to focus on [recruitment and retention of students of color in higher education](#), [ending sexual assault on campuses](#), and [securing more state and federal funding for grants](#). Congress is one of the two opportunities a year that the entire membership is brought together to determine and implement USSA's agenda for the upcoming year.

Why You Should Come

- National Student Congress is a space to present great ideas to leaders of the national student movement, build skills on organizing and leadership, network with students from across the country and representatives of ally organizations, get informed about current issues affecting students and working families and advance your career opportunities while building lifelong friendships.

Who Should Come

- Any one is who is or interested in organizing for educational, economic and social justice on their campus should come to NSC 2015, regardless of their school's membership status. You will get the chance to witness and/or have a say in creating and shaping the framework of the national student movement.

Trainings and Workshops

- At the 68th annual NSC, in addition to several entertaining activities with educational components attached, USSA will be providing a mixture of skill-based and issue-based workshops, where students can develop their organizing skills and learn from each other, as well as professional organizers about the problems that currently affect students and offer

solutions that make concrete improvements in the campus community. In the past we have offered workshops on media organizing, coalition building, organizing 101, etc. and this year we plan to hold various trainings and workshops on current issues affecting students and higher education.
